



## Planetary Mini Quilt

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A colorful min-quilt perfect to display as a room brightening wall hanging.

### Fabric Needed

### Tools Needed

Sewing machine and related supplies  
Rotary cutting tools  
Accuquilt® cutter and 3½" Drunkard's Path Die (optional)

## Assembly

Step 1. Cut nine 4½" strips from background fabric. From these strips cut seventy-two 4½" squares. Set aside eight squares.

Step 2. Cut three 3½" strips from each of the main fabrics. Cut twenty-two 3½" squares of each fabric from these strips.

Step 3. Cut Fuse-Under™ into 4½" strips. Cut sixty-four 4½" squares from these strips.

Step 4. Using either an Accuquilt® 3½" Drunkard's Path die or the printable pattern piece B, cut the 3½" squares as shown.

Step 5. Using either an Accuquilt® large-shaped die or printable pattern piece A, cut the 4½" squares as shown.

Step 6. Using pattern piece C, cut the eight 4½" background squares set aside and cut two half circles from each.

Step 7. Using pattern piece C, cut two half circles from each square of the Fuse-Under™.

Step 8. Mark the center points on each piece.

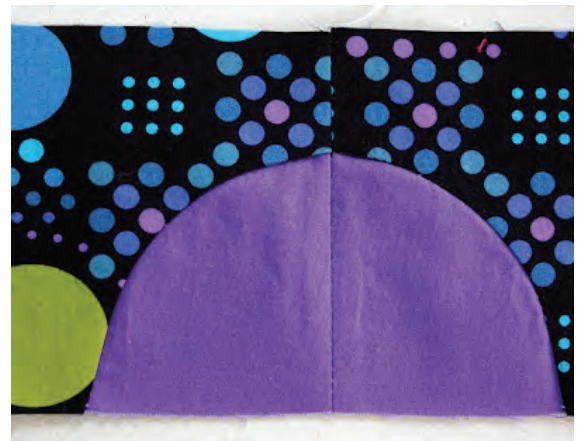
Step 9. Place one large background piece and one main piece right sides together. Pin the start and finish of both pieces. Match and pin the center point. Place two additional pins, as shown in picture.

Step 10. Sew the seam easing the curve. Press seam toward the background fabric.

Step 11. Repeat these steps for all 64 units.



Step 12. Sew units together, matching main fabrics into groups of two. Match the seam allowances. Press seams to the left.



Step 13. Repeat until there are 32 pairs of units.

Step 14. Iron the Fuse-Under™ pieces to the wrong side of each fabric piece C following manufacturer's instructions.



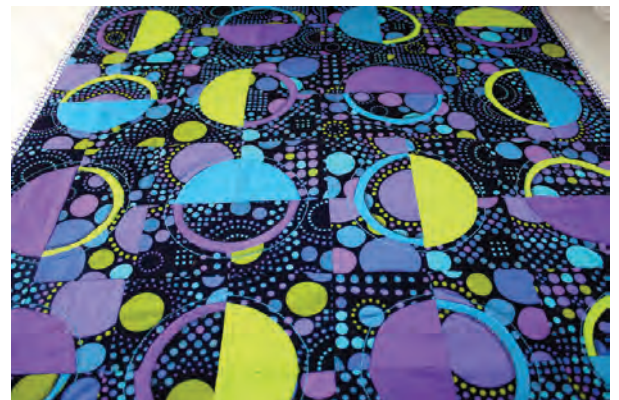
Step 15. Choose sixteen of the blocks, dividing it up between the three different fabrics.

Step 16. Remove paper backing and center fabric piece C in the middle of a main fabric half circle, with raw edges aligned. Fuse into place following manufacturer's instructions.

Step 17. Applique curved edge with a zigzag or blanket stitch.

Step 18. Repeat for all sixteen blocks.

Step 19. Lay out the blocks. Match one applique unit with one solid unit, creating a four-square unit. Sew blocks together. Press seams toward the solid units.



Step 20. Place the blocks into rows. There will be four rows of four blocks each. Press seams for rows 1 and 3 to the left. Press seams for rows 2 and 4 to the right.

Step 21. Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt  $\frac{1}{2}$ " away from curved edges. Bind quilt.
